I often think nostalgically back to the Reading Gamesfairs, and still sometimes drink my whiskey from one of the commemorative glasses.

Tonight I shall get the glass out, give it a polish, pour a drop and raise it to him. Well lived Chris!

Reading matter

I have recently got round to reading Susanna Clarke's *Piranesi* and this is another fascinating book. It consists of first-person journal entries from someone whose world is The House – a succession of halls, vestibules, staircases and passages, decorated with numerous statues and subject to tidal flooding. It chronicles the narrator's exploration of this world and the happenings within it, but our narrator is the only living person here – apart from their occasional meetings with The Other. (Though there are some dead people, whom the narrator regards as also being inhabitants of The House.) The Other calls the narrator Piranesi, but "as far as I remember it is not my name."



The narrative raises questions immediately. If this is the narrator's world how do they know all these words that have no referent in The House? How do they know that The Other is male? That he is 50-60 years old? That some of the bodies are women? And others children? How/when did they learn to write? Or is the author translating into English words that we would understand to refer to the narrator's concepts? My mind is boggled in a brilliant, enchanting way!

I was utterly captivated by the narrative as we learn about The House and what the narrator considers important. But then things change and we are swept along as 'Piranesi' discovers that all is what it seems. Sadly, I found the conclusion of the story disappointing as what we – and 'Piranesi' – discover is ordinary. Mundane, even. Though this is coming from someone who's been steeped in fantasy and SF for over 50 years – I suspect my idea of "ordinary", in the context of a fantasy novel, may not be how most people would see it. Or maybe it's just in comparison to Clarke's marvellous first novel, *Jonathan Strange and Mr Norrell*.

Despite this, *Piranesi* is a wonderful, entertaining read. I'm guessing the title is a clue to how we should see The House – as if it were depicted by Giovanni Battista Piranesi. And one of the statues rang bells with me: a faun with his forefinger pressed to his lips. Surely that's Mr Tumnus from *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe*. I suspect more of the statues (woman carrying beehive? Two Kings

playing chess?) are references to other stories/events/history. And there's an explicit reference to one of Colin Wilson's novels that fascinated me as a youngster. Have a look for yourself.

Games Events

I've recently come across PunchedCON, a weekend event for wargamers, but explicitly those who play board wargames – “There are plenty of conventions and events in the UK catering for miniatures wargaming.” It takes place at the Royal Court Hotel in Coventry from 12th-14th May. It appears to be essentially open gaming with the opportunity to organise/join specific games beforehand. Note that there are no day tickets and there's more information at punchedcon.com

The following weekend, 19th-21st May, sees the return of HandyCon, but a change of venue. The eighth HandyCon will be held at the Marriott Delta Hotel in Milton Keynes. It's essentially an open gaming event with a games library, demos, large organised games, a bring & buy and so on. It's much praised by some of my gaming friends, but it's not an event I've attended. 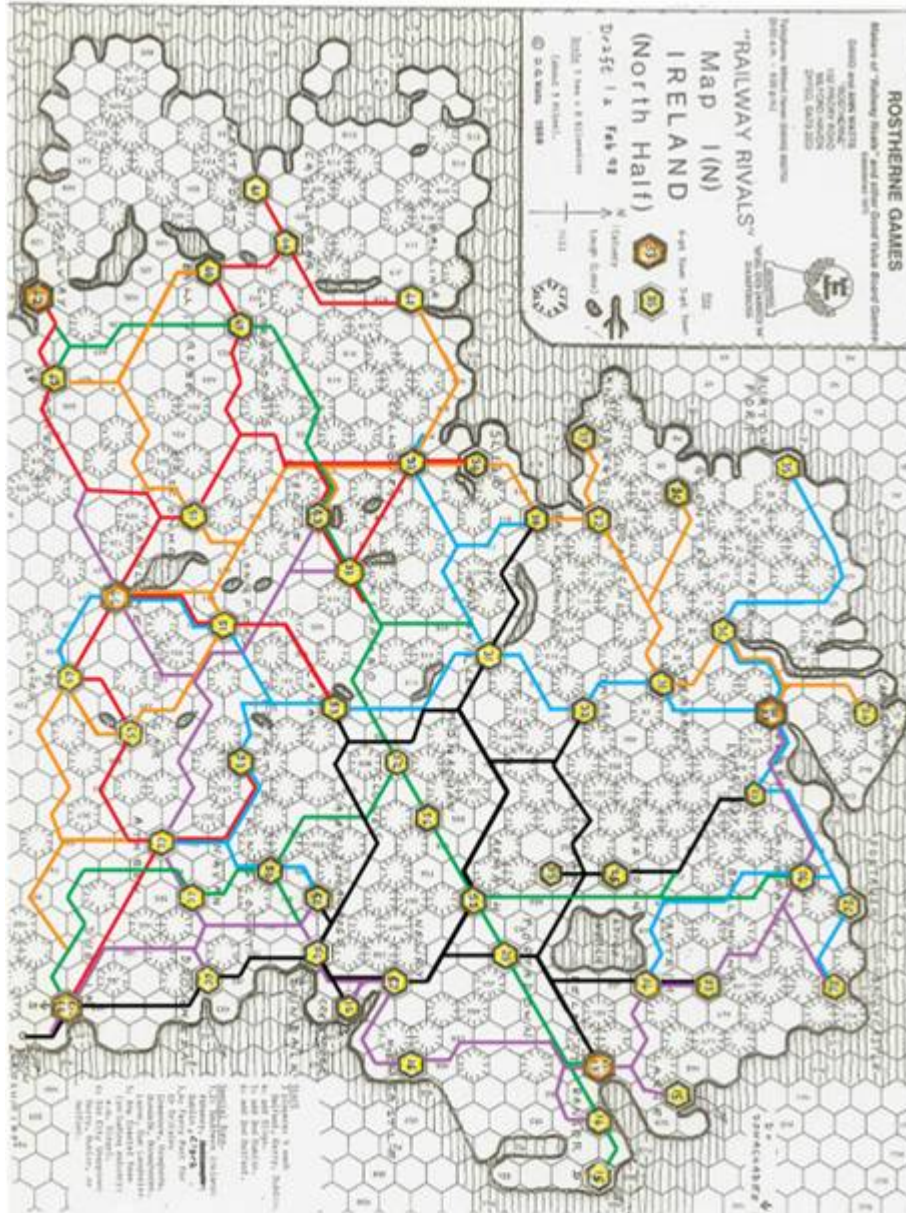

Mike Pollard has his excuses ready: "My narrow lead might disappear quickly, because I know nothing about most of the categories in turn 7. Having spent half an hour schlepping through long lists of mystifying game titles on the internet, I

managed to cobble together a final selection." Not to worry, Mike, you've managed to stay a whole two points ahead of Charles Burrows.

What's this about?

I have cribbed these rules from the *Variable Pig* website. You can find the originals (with lots of variants) at: variablepig.org/rules/bypop.html

Each turn the GM lists six categories and an initial letter. All players have to do is find something that fits the category and begins with the initial letter; they score points equal to the number of people who offer the same answer. The winner is the person with the most points at the end (after a pre-determined number of turns).

Example: The initial letter is A and the category is cities in Holland. 13 people give Amsterdam as their answer and score 13 points each, 6 people suggest Alkmaar and score 6 points each, 3 suggest Arnhem and score 3 points each.

I suspect I've got the hardest job: deciding on the categories! Anyway, we'll run this for 10 turns and see what happens.

- 1 A British SF author (but not Smith).

- 6 A Hugo-winning novel.

November 1674 (369)

It's a mild November this year, providing clement weather as Phillippe F'Loppe and his sabre trot off to a meeting – the second month running he's been one side of the only duel. His opponent is, again, a member of the Queen's Own Carabiniers: Roger d'Horne this time. As a cavalryman, Horne also wields a sabre. The two men are evenly matched, then, though Horne isn't quite as skilled as his adversary. Ben e'Volence attends to second F'Loppe.

Horne tries to take F'Loppe by surprise with a lunge, but this is deflected by F'Loppe's slash and does very little damage. Unlike the slash. Both then inflict a slash on their adversary. And another one – though F'Loppe throws in a block for a good measure. His third slash is just the start of a furious routine. The cut that follows thumps Horne hard. He aborts his next slash to throw in the towel.

Regimental shuffling

Minister of State Beau Reese Jean Seine continues to leave vacancies in his government – neither Commissioner of Public Safety, nor Chancellor of the Exchequer is filled this month. Similarly, Field Marshal Jacques de Gain declines to appoint Army commanders, turning down Leonard de Hofstadt's applications.

Petit-Garson Riche calls in a favour to persuade the senior Captain in the Cardinal's Guard to quit. However, he doesn't expect Tarquin le Hatter to support the Captain, ensuring he stays in place. Hatter has just resigned from the Grand Duke Max Dragoons and now applies to join the Cardinal's men. He is quickly accepted and buys his way to the rank of Major, taking command of a battalion.

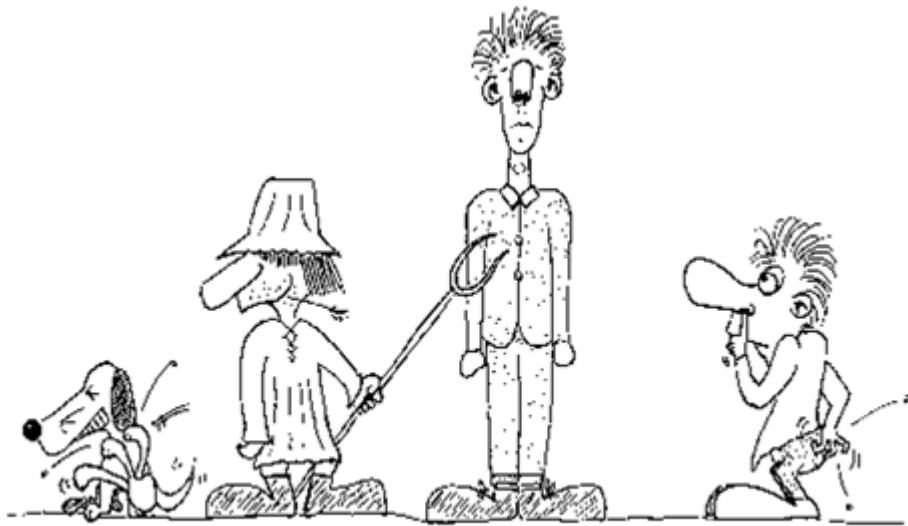
He is subordinate to Riche, however, as the Captain-as-was has just become Lieutenant-Colonel.

In the King's Musketeers, Zeold von Tu (who's actually in the Royal Foot Guards) supports KM Captain Henri Tard's request for the regiment's Major to leave. The Major brushes off Tu's paltry influence.

Grand Duke Max's don't seem to notice Hatter's departure – it's just one less Captain. 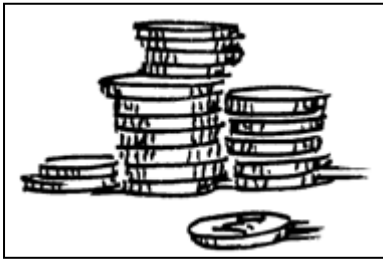

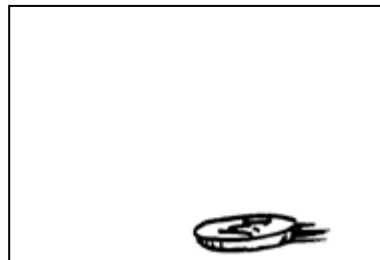

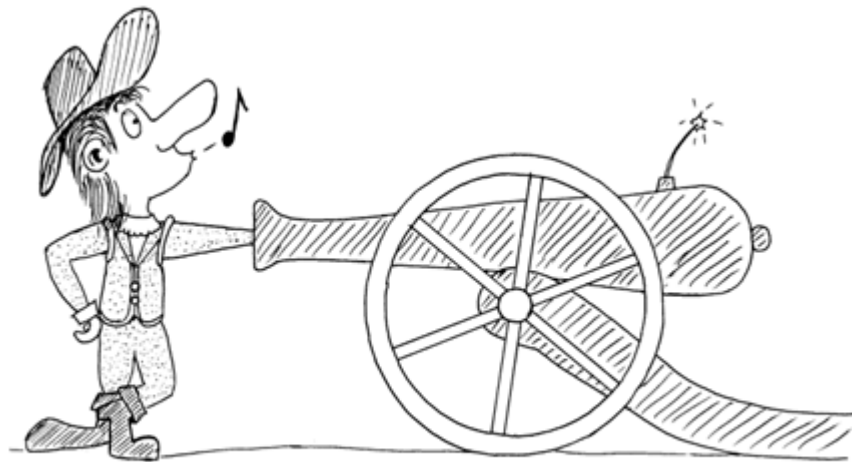
And Thomas de la Lune re-visits Blue Gables with Violet.

Defend Maastricht!

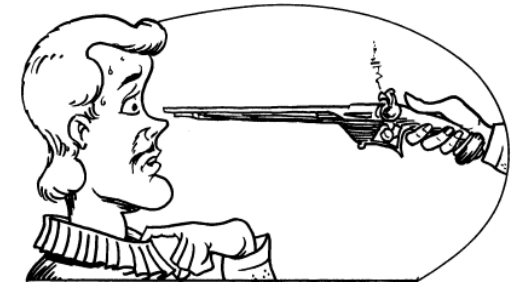

Lt-Col Claude Oppere leads his squadron of the Dragoon Guards into the fray as well and picks up a similar amount in loot.
