I mentioned daffodils last issue and Ickenham's churchyard (St Giles) had a fine crop – they were definitely out in good time for St David's Day. Our own daffs deigned to flower as April started. By then, it was full-on blossom season.

I'm surprised no-one responded to my query in last issue's Reading Matter asking why Samuel Delany, an American SF author, used 'curb' rather than 'kerb' in *Dhalgren*, the book I was writing about. The answer being that Americans spell 'kerb' as 'curb'. At least it's obvious from context which meaning applies – unlike some other British/American confusions.

Online stats

The PDFs of *TWJO* 252 were published on 3rd March and were downloaded 185 times in the rest of the month. March saw 55 more downloads for *TWJO* 251 to make 218 in two months. Letters

Tim Macaire has a seasonal observation.

Spring Equinox! It must be time for a snowstorm...

Nah, not until April. I can certainly recall snow at Easter in years gone by. While celebrating the arrival of Spring, Jonathan Palfrey has a word on spelling.

I noticed that you kept the spelling of 'Civilization' but changed 'recognized' in my message to 'recognised'. I, too, was taught as a child to spell these words with s rather than z, but sometime in early adulthood I was persuaded by the Oxford English Dictionary that the spelling with z is the authentic and original English spelling, derived from Latin, whereas the spelling with s was introduced in the 19th century in imitation of French. There seems no reason for us to imitate the French, especially as the z is a better match for the pronunciation.

That's interesting: I've always believed that 's' is the British spelling and 'z' American. However, I'm not going to argue with the *OED*. My own (paper) dictionary is an elderly (1983) Collins. It gives "recognise/recognize" as being derived from Latin: *recognoscere*. Definitely an 's' there. Searches on the internet support Jonathan, but also suggest that "recognise" is preferred in British English.

Jonathan picks up on books by Samuel Delany (see last issue's Reading Matter).

I have a feeling that I bought Dhalgren long ago but never got far into it. Babel-17 is one of my favourite books, and I quite like the novella Time Considered as a Helix of Semi-Precious Stones, but I have yet to find anything else by Delany that I like. Rather odd, that. Some authors produce plenty of books that I like, others only one or two.

Babel-17 is a fairly short and action-packed novel. It does include some unconventional sexual relationships, but they're just talked about in odd moments, as far as I remember: any sex happens offstage.

The protagonist of the novel, Rydra Wong, is a poetess who is also a linguist, a cryptographer, and incidentally a spaceship captain. She has been asked to make sense of Babel-17, which has been heard in use only in connection with damaging sabotage incidents by persons unknown. It's assumed to be code of some kind, but she figures out that it's a language. In the background, there is an interstellar war going on. There is a weird kind of afterlife in this universe: dead people can continue to exist as spirits of a kind, can talk to the living through some kind of communication device, and can do useful jobs.

Babel-17 turns out to be a particularly powerful language that (in effect) enhances human intelligence, but with side-effects.

Hmm, don't think I've read that – I'll add it to the list.

Reading Matter

Having finally finished *Dhalgren* (see last issue), the book I most wanted to read next was *The Stone Sky*, the final volume in NK Jemisin's "Broken Earth" trilogy. To recap, this Earth has a single, unstable continent and is wracked by periodic geological upheavals – the fifth seasons of the first book's title. For years ash fills the sky, the planet cools and nothing will grow. Humanity has to survive on what it has stored, following rules laid down in ages past.

However, these humans have an extra organ in their heads. This allows the 'orogene' minority to sense – and control – geology, generating what are effectively supernatural powers. Orogene children are thus very dangerous – a two year-old that can cause earthquakes and kill at whim?! – and usually killed when identified. Unless spotted by a 'Guardian' and whisked away to the Fulcrum organisation where adult orogenes can train them to control their powers and serve humanity. Or kill them.

This book picks up the story of our original heroine, "you" (now using the name Essun), and her estranged daughter, Nassun. Both powerful orogenes, they want to harness the crystal 'obelisks' (networking them as "The Obelisk Gate" – the title of the second book) that hang in the air in the way bricks don't (to quote a very different author). This will let them capture the Moon as its erratic orbit brings it back to the Earth. But not for the same purpose...

Interpolated with these two narratives is a third, taking us back to the original creation and purpose of the obelisks. This introduces us to a long-ago civilisation, before the Earth was broken (and the Moon sent on its way), and we gradually discover who the enigmatic stone eaters are. (We've already discovered that what they eat is orogenes who've tried to harness the obelisks and are turning to stone as a result. This doesn't bode well for Essun or Nassun...)

The story reaches a crescendo with the final confrontation between mother and daughter as the Moon returns. And all that's left is the tidying up. *The Obelisk Gate* brings the story to a satisfactory conclusion and has an explanation of what has been going on for millennia. However, I didn't find it as entertaining as the previous volumes. Perhaps because we're largely on familiar ground with Essun and Nassun. I strongly recommend the series as a whole, though – it has been quite magical exploring this Broken Earth.



The big news this Quarter was a technical breakthrough in Monopoles. Production advances mean that more Monopoles can be produced from a given volume with the expectation that prices will steadily fall with time.

ROCKET TRADERS were last out of the blocks this Quarter, choosing to jump after everyone else. Vanguard went into Safe Berth at Tau Ceti, though their ships were loaded with goods for next Quarter.

At Gamma Leporis MADNESS & MAYHEM bought 5 Alloys on Contract.

Trading at Epsilon Eridani was COSTA NOSTRA COFFEE INC selling 2 Isotopes for 12 HTs apiece.

COSTA NOSTRA COFFEE were doing bigger trades at Tau Ceti, selling 12 Alloys for 8 HTs each and gaining a Dealership.

COSTA NOSTRA COFFEE intended to unload some of their Monopole stockpile at Mu Herculis, but the recent breakthrough meant their bid of 14 was ignored as prices dropped.

At Sigma Draconis SOLAR SPICE & LIQUORS bought 5 Spice on Contract, after which TREKBOER bought 8 Isotopes for 6 HTs each, taking a Contractors' position, and then 6 Alloys for 2 HTs apiece to get a Dealership as well. What they lacked was storage.

At Beta Hydri MADNESS & MAYHEM sold 2 Alloy for 8 HTs each. SOLAR SPICE & LIQUORS then sold a single Spice for 10 HTs and MADNESS & MAYHEM unloaded 7 more at the same price and became dealers.

TREKBOER jumped to Tau Ceti on planet and took OP 3, loading weapons. On Sigma Draconis they belatedly bought more storage and at Beta Hydri shipyards they laid down a Phoenix hull, Beluga, with augmented jump, 6 cargo pods, and A class crew. Some of their gains being recycled already.


ROCKET TRADERS launched their Corco Iota Hull at Tau Ceti Shipyards and moved it to a safe berth.

Much more surprising is what Frank X Change is up to. He resigns as Lieutenant-Colonel of the King's Musketeers and signs on with their arch-enemies, the Cardinal's Guard. This explains his suggestion that the CG Lt-Colonel should resign. He's even called in a couple of favours to help this happen, but Terence Cuckpowder puts his influence behind the Lt-Col and the man retains his position. Change buys his way back up to Major and transfers his kit from one bivouac to another before his former colleagues can spot his new uniform.

Cuckpowder's more usual activity is providing cash to recent arrivals and this is something he continues this month. For his part, Camille de Polignac makes a substantial donation to "Tiny" Thierry Toothpick, the new CPS – "in recognition of the great work he does in keeping all of us safe."


Yep, still besieging

While First and Cavalry Divisions head off to relieve Maastricht, Field Army commander Jacques de Gain marshals his remaining troops to continue the Army's own siege. The spoils of war make him over a thousand crowns richer and he gains a Mention in Despatches ("Good job he's already earmarked for Field Marshal").

This leaves Second Division in the van of the action and its commander, Zavier Ulric Turenne, hurls himself at the enemy. Literally. It's like he's wearing The Wrong Trousers. Luckily, Second Foot Brigade is right on his heels and overruns the Dutch positions. For Turenne there are two MiDs ("Bravest thing I've ever seen" "Ditto"). His newly appointed Adjutant, Charles PiedLuminaire, is busy getting to grips with his administrative duties and has his brevet rank (Lieutenant-Colonel) made permanent.

Second Foot Brigadier Armand Alsace removes the brevet from his rank (Brigadier-General in this case) and appropriates well over a thousand crowns for his own coffers. The damage to the Dutch forces is caused by the 13th Fusiliers and their Colonel, Hugo Furst, is brevetted to Bdr-Gen while gathering close to 1,500 crowns for himself. The 53rd back up the 13th and Captain Sebastiane Blanc-Chevaux finds himself Mentioned ("Commanding a Battalion while a Captain").

Third Foot isn't as successful, but Captains Agaric Champignon and Justin Cartier survive handily in the 27th Musketeers, as does Bdr-Gen Jean d'Aubergine commanding the 4th Arquebusiers.



As usual, the Royal North Highlanders are the success story in the Frontier Division, with now three general officers commanding the battalions. General Rick Shaw collects exactly fifteen hundred crowns' worth of loot – mind you, he's received money from Paris, too. Brevet General Jacques Hatt amasses an exact one thousand crowns' worth – that will let him repay

some of his hefty loan from Louis Severin Descartes. And new arrival Lt-General Bernard de Lur-Saluces picks up just over 500. He does get a Mention in Despatches ("Johnny-come-lately!") into the bargain, though.

Dragoon Brigade continues its roving brief, but finds slim pickings this month. Brigadier Louis Severin Descartes collects a little booty (just over 500 crowns' worth), while Brigade Major Botte Le Chimiste gets even less – half as much as his boss in fact. Good job Louis has lent him some cash, then.

With the regiment's two senior officers running the Brigade, Grand Duke Max's Dragoons are commanded by Major Elroi le Flingue. As acting CO, le Flingue is Mentioned twice ("Stepping up"), which gets him a Knighthood. Junior Major Maurice Danseur has his brevet rank made permanent and is Mentioned as well ("A little promotion"). After collecting some 500 crowns' worth of loot, Captain Pierre De Terre also has his brevet rank solidified. A little bravery from trooper Ignace Pardaillon sees him loot a couple of hundred crowns' worth of goodies. Trooper Steve De Sade isn't brave and doesn't get anything.

Maastricht relieved!

The Cavalry Division trots towards Maastricht, clearing Allied patrols and pickets as it goes. Commander Ben e'Volence is brevetted to General and ensures he gets a big share of the booty: well over two thousand crowns' worth.

The Queen's Own Carabiniers are the Division's success story. They trounce the Imperial cavalry that tries to stop their advance, plundering their supplies to good effect. Justin Thyme is QOC Colonel and takes just under 1,500 crowns' worth of booty. He is promoted to (brevet) Brigadier-General. Surviving a close encounter with an Imperial dragoon, Lt-Col Come Asiouar's loot is worth almost two thousand crowns. His personal success is rewarded with a Barony. There's a Knighthood for Major Ian Deditte to go with just over fifteen hundred crowns' worth of loot and a Mention in Despatches. Captain Con Stantinople's share is closer to two thousand crowns, which means he can easily buy the horses he needs for his new rank of Major.

The QOCs colleagues in the Horse Guards Brigade, the Dragoon Guards, don't do as well, but CO Balzac Slapdash is still able to add over 1,500 crowns to his wealth. He is Mentioned in Despatches too ("Not as good as the carabiniers!") and takes over as Horse Guards Brigadier.

The Cuirassiers in the Heavy Brigade don't have such opposition. Colonel Hugh Jeneaux, leading Archduke Leopold's men, still pockets over a thousand crowns' worth of loot though. His opposite number in the Crown Prince's boys, Stephane Etrange, just gets a (small) Mention ("No loot here"). However, he does get to be Heavy Brigadier for the last days of the season. There's a similar MiD for his number two, Lt-Col François de Blanchefort. Having just bought the rank of Major, there's an even briefer MiD for Arent Hayes ("Need more ink"), while trooper Vaux de Fon is pleased just to survive.

Using the intelligence gathered by the cavalry, First Division is able to hit the besieging force hard. Its success allows the soldiers lots of loot. Division commander Greg de Bécqueur gets over 2,500 crowns worth to go with his double Mention in Despatches ("Stunning success").

The Guards Brigade assaults the English regiments that are part of the besieging force. The Royal Guards and the Musketeers cut through them while the Cardinal's men struggle. There are Mentions for Brigadier Zeold von Tu, who also gets fifteen hundred crowns' worth of English 'memorabilia'. His Brigade Major, Martin de Garnache, takes just over 1,500 crowns' worth.



Beau Reese Jean Seine's brevet rank has expired, so he leads the Royal Foot Guards as Colonel. The regiment's success brings him over a thousand crowns in booty. Lt-Colonel Camille de Polignac plunders the same amount for himself. Major Hector William Boone goes larger, looting over fifteen hundred crowns to go with his Mention in Despatches ("Good looting skills"). Senior Captain Neville Moore's looting is on a par with his Colonel's. Captain Felipe Savant takes his looting to exactly 1,500 crowns' worth. There are MiDs for him ("Exactly? Exactly!"). And Captain Thierry Toothpick gets a little bit more.

Exactly fifteen hundred crowns is also the value of KM Colonel Claude de Nord's plunder. He is also Mentioned for his foresight in appointing an able Adjutant to boost the Regiment's competence. There two Mentions for the new Major in the Cardinal's Guard, Frank X Change, but nothing else ("No loot here. Hang on, wasn't he a Musketeer last month?").

Percival Puffington, in charge of the Picardy Musketeers, receives two Mentions in Despatches for their accomplishments and loots over 1,500 crowns' worth. A Knighthood comes his way as a result (of the accomplishments, not the looting).

Another Knighthood goes to Marcel Hatch Dupree, Lt-Col of the Royal Marines, after he is Mentioned for surviving the impact of an English musketball. A bit of looting sees him almost a thousand crowns richer. Captain Chemin de Fer outshines him with nearly fifteen hundred crowns' worth. Two hundred of that goes on buying a couple of horses as he is brevetted to Major.



All this reflects well on First Foot Brigadier Henri DuShite, who gains exactly two thousand crowns in plunder and two Mentions in Despatches.

The French attack forces the Dutch/Spanish/Imperial/English besieging force to pack up and march off. Retaining possession of Maastricht gives the French side more leverage as peace talks start in the town of Nijmegen.

Last quiet month in Paris

New boy Justin Saad begins his time in Paris by applying to join the Blue Gables club. Alas, he doesn't meet the criteria for membership and thus spends some time kicking his heels. Still, at least he is able to attend Louis Renault's party, alongside Hugo Serre, who is showing off his new conquest, Sue Briquet. ❖
